Birthday display in Reception starting from January – number focus to regarding 5 frames. Celebration of children's birthdays as they happen (one year old)

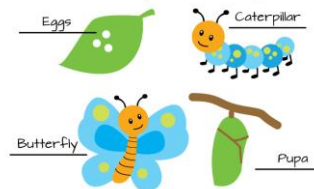


Family topic in Autumn and Summer term – discussing their place in their families, when they were born, what could they do when they were born, what can they do now

**History in the past examples**  
Toys from the past, Jo Jo and Gran Gran (voyage from St Lucia in 1960s, Bonfire night links to Guy Fawkes (child friendly version) and Remembrance Day



**History reflecting us as a church school** – Jesus' birth and death (what time of the year this happened and how many years ago did it happen), the Bible (two parts old and new – stories from this book including the stories Jesus heard and Jesus told too)  
World Faiths – other festivals beyond the Christian ones (Sukkot, Hanukkah, Divali, Chinese New Year – all involving stories from the past)
